

It was my pleasure to announce at the United Benefice Service at Easton on the first Sunday of July that Bishop David has confirmed that Revd Deirdre West is to be our next Priest-in-Charge. Below is an extract of the email from the Archdeacon about her appointment:

Following a good interview process this week, supported by our patrons, Bishop David is pleased to appoint The Rev Deirdre West as priest in charge of the Benefice. I know we can rely on your prayers as she prepares to undertake a changed role. There will be a formal licensing service later in the year.

It is always challenging when a priest retires and for several months Deirdre has held the benefice churches together in an efficient and supportive way as the Assistant Priest. She has also conducted several baptisms, weddings and funerals and offered pastoral care in the community. Some time ago is was agreed by the bishop that she could change her ministerial role from being a self-supporting minister to a stipendiary, full time priest in charge and Deirdre felt strongly that God was calling her to offer herself as the priest in this benefice.

As we enter a new phase in the church's life and ministry I pray Deirdre will be supported and encouraged by the ministry team, PCC's and congregations as we move forward together seeking new growth both spiritually and in our Christian journey of discipleship.

St Elizabeth Hospice's Suffolk Cycle Challenge is coming up in August and we're encouraging supporters to get on their bike and cycle through the beautiful Suffolk countryside. It's suitable for all ages and abilities, with three routes to choose from, see below...

<u>Take on the Suffolk Cycle Challenge in support of St Elizabeth</u> <u>Hospice</u>

St Elizabeth Hospice supporters are climbing into the saddle for a cycle ride through the idyllic Suffolk countryside on Sunday 31st August.

Starting and finishing at Framlingham College, the event features a choice of two main routes: one is 40 miles, the other a more challenging 80. There is also a short route of 6-7 miles which the whole family can enjoy together.

Joanne Rodger, Events and Challenges Fundraiser at St Elizabeth Hospice, said: "This event is suitable for cyclists of all abilities, from families riding with their children to seasoned riders taking on long distance routes. Suffolk has some beautiful scenery for the riders to enjoy along their way, and we hope that the Suffolk Cycle Challenge will raise thousands of pounds for local Hospice care."

Cyclists are asked to raise sponsorship, and all proceeds raised will help the Hospice, an independent charity which costs £9.1 million a year to run, and relies on fundraising events, individual donations and income generated from its shops to meet the majority of these costs.

Entry for the 40 or 80 mile rides is £30; riders must be aged 13 or older, and all riders under 18 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

The family route is just £10, with those under 16 riding for free.

The route will feature refreshment stops to give riders a chance to refill their water bottles and buy food and drink.

St Elizabeth Hospice improves life for people living with a progressive illness in East Suffolk and South Norfolk.

Last year it cared for over 2,000 people and 2014 is its 25th Anniversary year.
