### **Report from Kettleburgh Parish Council meeting held on 9 November**

SCC Cllr Peter Bellfield spoke about the new Chief Executive of SCC, Deborah Cadman. She had previously been CE to St Edmundsbury Council and the East of England Development Agency, and was appointed by a unanimous vote, with a salary of £155,000. Suffolk libraries are to be run by a charitable company and with a consequent reduction in business rates, there will be a 28% saving of costs. It is expected that the current fleet of 6 mobile libraries will be halved, with monthly rather than fortnightly visits. All Highway maintenance will be put out to private tender with a reduction in overall costs.

The report sent from our District Councillor, Bob Snell, gave details of the timetable for the production of the Local Development Framework; outlined some of the fears expressed of the National Planning Policy Framework; and welcomed the inclusion of Wickham Market in the route for the Olympic torch next July.

There was no Police report, but Councillors expressed their concern over the continued communications received about the Community Speed Watch campaign. You can read full details in the Parish Council minutes.

More information on other topics covered at this meeting - Broadband coverage in Kettleburgh and plans for the Diamond Jubilee celebrations, can be read elsewhere in this newsletter.

Notes from an on-site meeting held at the Pound in October were brought to the meeting, where it was agreed that the canopy of the lime tree should be raised, that the nettles should be sprayed with weedkiller when they are actively growing in Spring 2012, and that bulb planting should be delayed until the nettles are dealt with. The Management Plan for maintenance of the Pound will be reviewed at the meeting in January.

The budget for 2012-13 was discussed. It was noted that the Parish Council's only source of income is the precept and that there is very little margin for cutting costs. The final budget will be agreed at the January meeting and the precept set for 2012-13.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 14 March at 7:15pm in the Village Hall, with refreshments served from 7:00p.m. You are most welcome to attend.

### **Planning applications in Kettleburgh**

C11/2249: The Old Piggery, The Street – Erection of 2 new cart ports, a single garage and relocation of polytunnel.

C/11/2436: Land NE of School House – Erection of shed for storage of a tractor and other agricultural implements.

Both of these applications were approved by the Parish Council and by SCDC.

C11/2591: The Old Rectory - Provision of a ménage

The decision from SCDC has not yet been made on this application.

### **Kettleburgh Broadband Survey - Feedback**

Many thanks to those people who responded to the Kettleburgh Broadband Survey. Sadly the response was very low with only 4 households giving any information about their broadband experience. Combining this response with the speed tests conducted by Parish Councillors we can see a wide range of broadband download speeds across our community. The southern half of the village languishes around 0.6Mbit/s whilst the northern end can achieve rates of around 4.3Mbit/s. The average is around 1.9Mbit/s. User perception of the service received ranged from "totally inadequate" to "perfectly satisfactory for what I do".

This is typical for an East Anglian rural community.

Given the low concern shown by parishioners regarding broadband, and the fact that it appears Kettleburgh is not any more disadvantaged than any other similar community, the Parish Council is not planning any more proactive action on this subject. We encourage all parishioners who are unhappy with their broadband service to be persistent with complaints to their service provider. We will continue to report on National and Regional developments as appropriate.

### **Preparing the Parish Council Budget**

The following points were considered at the November Parish Council meeting, in preparation for setting the budget for 2012-13 and determining the annual precept in January:

- As the traffic calming measures have been financed externally, the reserves that were built up to cover this are being gradually reduced.
- The only source of income is the precept raised.
- As expenditure exceeds income, there will be a point in the future when there are no further reserves from which to draw.
- It may be prudent to raise the precept in line with inflation, especially as the recent slight increase in houses in Kettleburgh will mean a lower tax burden per property.
- A projection for the next three years will be undertaken.

They claim that you have recently had an update on your PC and it has come to their attention you have serious issues with your computer. They offer to show you how to locate the problem and will take you into your computer's software. This will always show warnings and errors and is NOT a fault. Microsoft will never call you directly and offer to run repairs on your computer.
